This training is ideal for those in health and social care roles, particularly those involved in palliative care or supporting individuals nearing the end of life. Whether you are new to the field or seeking to enhance your understanding, this course provides foundational knowledge and practical skills aligned with NHS best practices. You will explore the core principles of palliative and end of life care, including the development and importance of an end of life care plan in maintaining dignity and respect. Additionally, you will learn how to facilitate discussions about the care plan and understand the role of healthcare teams in the end of life care process.
